LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

SECOND READING:

Romans 8:8-17

Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you. So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live. Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

REFLECTION ON THE ASCENSION OF CHRISTThe Feast of the Ascension is so often mistaken for a farewell.

The unthinking heart may regard it as the departure of Christ—as though, having done His work, He simply "left." But the Christian imagination, once awakened, knows better. For the Ascension is not the celebration of absence, but of presence—presence transfigured and gloriously multiplied. Christ did not withdraw from the world; He entered more deeply into it. We must not be misled by the spatial language of "up" or "away." Christ did not ascend into a locale among the stars, as though Heaven were merely a remote latitude in the cosmos. He ascended into a reality that transcends the visible and material. To say that He ascended "into Heaven" is to speak of another dimension altogether—one not less real than ours, but more. Imagine a square lifted into the third dimension; what seems to vanish has not ceased to be but has entered into a mode of being that includes and surpasses the one before it. Christ, like the cube to the square, now occupies a reality that is more capacious than ours—not less intimate but infinitely more so. The Resurrection, then, is not simply the promise that we shall live again—it is the pledge that we shall be changed. What was perishable shall put on the imperishable, and what was sown in weakness shall be raised in power. The Ascension follows this as the celebration not of conclusion, but of commission. It is the feast of hope, yes, but also of mission. For Christ is not only risen; He is reigning. Seated at the right hand of the Father, He now rules not as a distant monarch, but as the very Head through whom the Church receives its life. It is from that exalted place that He breathes His Spirit into His Body—the Church—and the Acts of the Apostles becomes the Acts of Christ through them. Observe it carefully. Jesus heals—so do they. He suffers—they too must suffer. It is not mimicry, but PARTICIPATION. The Church does not merely imitate Christ; she shares in His very life. The Crucifixion was no mere tragic end, but the definitive sacrifice, offered once and for all. Yet that sacrifice did not end with the Resurrection; rather, it broke into eternity with the Ascension. The Lamb once slain now stands eternally, and His offering echoes not just through time, but through eternity. It is precisely this eternal reality that is drawn near to us in the Eucharist. When we kneel at the altar, we are not merely remembering. We are being drawn into that same eternal sacrifice—the same Christ, the same body broken, the same blood poured out. It is not repeated, for what is eternal need not be repeated. It is *participated* in. The bread and wine do not merely remind; they elevate. Here, humanity touches glory—not by fleeing from its flesh, but by having that flesh assumed into a higher pitch of being. So let the world speak of absence if it will. We know better. The Ascension is not His going, but His reigning. It is not a disappearance, but a deepening of presence. He is not less with us, but more. And in the Mass, in the Spirit, and in the mission of the Church, we find ourselves caught up—not merely as observers, but as participants—in the great divine drama that begins with Incarnation, is crowned with Resurrection, and continues with Ascension: that the life of Christ may be ours, now and forever.
