Come to Me, All Who Are Weary

There is perhaps no stranger feature of modern civilisation than this: never have men possessed so many conveniences, and never have they seemed so weary. We have machines to save labour, devices to save time, and endless amusements to distract us, yet the promised freedom has somehow become exhaustion.

The reason is that we have mistaken independence for liberty. Modern man is told he must invent himself, create his own meaning, and establish his own worth. It sounds heroic until one attempt it. For if my value depends entirely upon my own success, then every failure becomes a threat to my very identity. Such a burden was never meant for creatures to bear.

It is therefore no surprise that an age devoted to self-expression is also haunted by anxiety. We spend our lives defending an image, seeking approval, and proving our significance before others who are equally insecure. The ego has become both the idol we worship and the tyrant that enslaves us. Our answer is usually to strive harder. We pursue achievement, wealth, influence, or even religion, hoping one more success will quiet the restless heart. Yet no amount of applause can satisfy a soul made for God.

Christ offers something entirely different. He does not say, "Improve yourself." He simply says, "Come to Me." He invites us not to greater self-mastery but to surrender. We fear this will diminish us, when in fact it frees us from the impossible task of saving ourselves. Many of us try to bargain with God. We surrender our sins but keep our pride; we offer Him our worship while reserving our ambitions. Yet a divided heart is always a weary heart. Christ asks for the whole of us, not because He delights in taking, but because only He can truly restore what we surrender.

Here lies the great paradox of Christianity: when we cease trying to manufacture our identity, we finally discover it. We do not lose ourselves in Christ; we receive a self that neither success nor failure can destroy, because it rests upon His love rather than our performance. This is why His yoke is easy and His burden light. He does not remove every labour, but He removes the impossible burden of being our own saviour. The deepest weariness is not physical but spiritual, and the deepest rest is found only when the soul entrusts itself to the One who made it.
