There is no god, other than you, who cares for everything, to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly; Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all. You show your strength when your sovereign power is questioned and you expose the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there. By acting thus, you have taught a lesson to your people how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men, and you have given your sons the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance.

The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

Remove God, and mercy disappears.

Wisdom 12:13, 16-19

There is perhaps no illusion more characteristic of our age than the conviction that God has died. Not that the Eternal has ceased to exist—that would be as absurd as believing the sun has vanished because one has closed his eyes—but that modern man has learned to live as though God were unnecessary. We have not disproved God; we have merely distracted ourselves from Him.

Our culture prizes autonomy above all things. We are told that freedom consists in creating ourselves, that identity is fashioned by desire rather than discovered in truth. Yet this promise conceals a heavy burden. If there is no Father, every soul must become its own creator and saviour, and no human heart was ever built to bear such a weight.

It is here that the Gospel interrupts our illusion. There come quiet moments when we realise we are not merely observed but completely known. Every hidden failure, every selfish ambition, every wound lies open before God. We fear such knowledge because we expect rejection. Yet the astonishing truth is that the eyes which see us most clearly are the very eyes that refuse to turn away.

This is mercy. It is not indulgence, nor the fashionable habit of explaining away evil. Mercy names sin truthfully because only truth can heal. Christ does not love us by ignoring our sin but by bearing it. The Cross is where justice and mercy meet—not with justice abandoned, but fulfilled in the self-giving love of the Son, who restores what we could never restore ourselves.

Such mercy is more demanding than mere forgiveness. Christ does not simply say, "You are excused." He says, "Follow Me." Mercy is an invitation to become new. It exposes our false selves, not to shame us, but to free us. Grace cannot be earned because love is not a wage but a gift.

Perhaps this explains why the modern proclamation of the "death of God" has yielded not greater freedom but deeper loneliness. Remove God, and mercy disappears. We are left either endlessly defending ourselves or endlessly condemning ourselves.

Yet the Christian proclamation remains unchanged: God is not dead. He is the living Father who still seeks His lost children. The Cross still stands at the centre of history as the everlasting sign that divine love has entered the darkest regions of the human heart and conquered them. For the greatest obstacle to mercy has never been our sin, but our pride. And mercy is not the end of the Christian life; it is where it truly begins.
