GOSPEL: Matthew 16:13-20

(Matthew 16:13–20), where Jesus asks His disciples,

"Who do you say that I am?"

There are questions which ask for information, and there are questions which ask for a decision. Christ’s question to Peter belongs to the second kind: “Who do you say that I am?” He is not conducting a survey. He is not interested in the popular opinion of the crowd. He is asking Peter—and us—to stop hiding behind the answers of other people and speak from the truth of our own hearts.

It is remarkably easy to have a borrowed faith. We inherit the words, attend the services, repeat the prayers, and perhaps assume that because we have always believed something, we truly believe it. But Christianity cannot remain a family heirloom. At some point, Christ must become not merely the God our parents taught us about, but the Lord whom we ourselves have chosen to follow. Peter’s answer is therefore more than a theological statement: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” He has moved from knowing something about Jesus to recognising who Jesus is. And once Peter sees Christ clearly, something extraordinary happens: Christ tells Peter who he is. Simon becomes Peter, the Rock. Here is the great paradox of the Christian life: we discover ourselves only after we have discovered Christ. Our age tells us to invent ourselves, construct our identity, and measure our worth by achievement, possessions, appearance, influence, or success. Yet these things are poor foundations. They can disappear as quickly as they came.

Christ offers something deeper. He does not merely give us a list of rules; He gives us a place in His story. When we put Him at the centre, our ordinary lives begin to look different. Our family becomes a vocation rather than an inconvenience. Our work becomes an opportunity for service. Our money becomes something entrusted to us rather than something that possesses us. Even suffering can become a place where trust is learned.

The question, then, is unavoidable: Who is Jesus to me? Not who is He to my parents, my Church, or my culture— BUT TO ME.

For if He is truly the Christ, then He cannot remain at the edge of our lives. He must become the centre. And strangely enough, when we finally give ourselves to Him, we do not lose ourselves. We begin, perhaps for the first time, to become the person God intended us to be.
